

# ASSOCIATION OF REMEDIAL MASSEURS INCORPORATED

## OBJECTS

1. The objects for which the Association is established are:
  - (a) To protect conserve safeguard and promote interests of masseurs and the interests generally of members of the Association in regard to matters of common interest.
  - (b) To consider and deal with all interests involving or affecting the profession.
  - (c) To obtain parliamentary and/or other legal acknowledgement of the rights and status of masseurs.
  - (d) To organise exhibitions and demonstrations in relation to and lectures on subjects appertaining to the said profession.
  - (e) To advocate and support proper and/or efficient and/or improved methods in relation to the said profession or in relation to any matters connected therewith and generally to educate the public in matters appertaining to the said profession.
  - (f) In furtherance of the objects of the Association to print and/or publish and/or circulate any newspaper journal periodical magazine or other publication connected with or relating to the said profession and to solicit and obtain advertisements in respect thereof and/or for insertion therein.
  - (g) To purchase and distribute among the Members of the Association and/or others either gratuitously or for payment, books leaflets pamphlets and/or other literature in furtherance of the objects of the Association.
  - (h) To train unqualified nominees for membership of the Association and to grant Certificates of Membership, Certificates of Proficiency and other credentials or evidence of proficiency in relation to the said provisions and to make charges for tuition and other proper charges in relation to the conduct of the Association and to conduct examinations by duly qualified examiners.
  - (i) To establish and/or keep a register or registers of the members of the Association.
  - (j) In furtherance of the objects of the Association to grant prizes awards and donations and

to establish competitions and generally to take measures for raising the standard of proficiency and/or promoting the well being of the profession.

- (k) To support and perfect the character status rights and interests of masseurs and generally to promote honourable practice in the conduct of the said profession.
- (l) To repress malpractice and to decide questions of proper usage etiquette or courtesy between and among members of the profession.
- (m) To arrange for the provision of legal and other assistance to members of the Association in relation to all questions touching or  
  
affecting the said profession and on a basis which will be beneficial to members.
- (n) To appoint and/or remove from time to time any person or persons to form an Examination Board to examine unqualified nominees for membership and for Certificates of Proficiency and to examine products for such purposes and at such times as a Committee of the Association may determine.
- (o) To form and maintain a library of books journals and other literature dealing with the matters of interest to members of the Association and to procure the delivery of lectures on such subjects.
- (p) To subscribe to, become a member of and co-operate with any other club, association or organisation, whether incorporated or not, whose objects are altogether or in part similar to those of the Association, provided that the Association shall not subscribe to or support with its funds any club, association or organisation which does not prohibit the distribution of income and property among its members.
- (q) In furtherance of the objects of the Association to buy, sell and deal in all kinds of apparatus and all kinds of provisions, liquid and solid, required by the members of the Association or persons frequenting the Association's premises.
- (r) To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire and otherwise acquire any lands, buildings, easements or property, real and personal, and any rights or privileges which may be requisite for the purposes  
  
of, or capable of being conveniently used in connection with any of the objects of the Association provided that in case the Association shall take or hold any property which may be subject to any trusts the Association shall only deal with the same in such manner as is allowed by law having regard to such trusts.
- (s) To enter into any arrangements with any Government or authority, supreme, municipal, local or otherwise, that may seem conducive to the Association's objects or any of them; and to obtain from any such Government or authority any rights, privileges and concessions which the Association may think it desirable to obtain; and to carry out, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions.
- (t) To appoint, employ, remove or suspend such managers, clerks, secretaries, servants, workmen and other persons as may be necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Association.
- (u) To establish and support or aid in the establishment and support of associations, institutions, funds, trusts and conveniences calculated to benefit employees or past employees of the Association or the dependants or connections of any such persons; and to grant pensions and allowances; and to make payments towards insurance; and to subscribe or

- guarantee money for charitable or benevolent objects, or for any public, general or useful object.
- (v) To construct, improve, maintain, develop, work, manage, carry out, alter or control any houses, buildings, grounds, works or conveniences which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to advance the Association's interests, and to contribute to, subsidise or otherwise assist and take part in the construction, improvement, maintenance, development, working, management, carrying out, alteration or control thereof.
  - (w) To invest and deal with the money of the Association not immediately required in such manner as may be permitted by law for the investment of trust funds.
  - (x) To borrow or raise or secure the payment of money in such manner as the Association may think fit and to secure the same or the repayment or performance of any debt liability contract guarantee or other engagement incurred or to be entered into by the Association in any way and in particular by the issue of debentures perpetual or otherwise charged upon all or any of the Association's property (both present and future), and to purchase, redeem or pay off any such securities.
  - (aa) To make, draw, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, bills of lading and other negotiable or transferable instruments.
  - (bb) In furtherance of the objects of the Association to sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, lease, dispose of, turn to, account or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Association.
  - (cc) To take or hold mortgages, liens and charges to secure payment of the purchase price or any unpaid balance of the purchase price, of any part of the Association's property of whatsoever kind sold by the Association, or any money due to the Association from purchasers and others.
  - (dd) To take any gift of property whether subject to any special trust or not, for any one or more of the objects of the Association but subject always to the proviso in paragraph (r) of this Clause.
  - (ee) To take such steps by personal or written appeals, public meetings or otherwise, as may from time to time be deemed expedient for the purpose of procuring contributions to the funds of the Association, in the shape of donations, annual subscriptions or otherwise.
  - (ff) To print and publish any newspapers, periodicals, books or leaflets that the Association may think desirable for the promotion of its objects.
  - (gg) In furtherance of the objects of the Association to amalgamate with any companies, institutions, societies, or associations having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Association and which shall prohibit the distribution of its or their income and property among its or their members.
  - (hh) In furtherance of the objects of the Association to purchase or otherwise acquire and undertake all or any part of the property, assets, liability and engagements of any one or more of the companies, institutions, societies or associations with which the Association is authorised to amalgamate.
  - (ii) In furtherance of the objects of the Association to transfer all or any part of the property, assets, liabilities and engagements of the Association to any one or more of the companies, institutions, societies or associations with which the Association is authorised to amalgamate.
  - (jj) To make donations for patriotic or charitable purposes.

- (kk) To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the objects and the exercise of the powers of the Association.
